80% below 1990 levels by 2050


#### Renewables Portfolio Standard

33% by 2020


50% by 2030

# Potential Benefits and Obstacles of Offshore Wind in California

### **Benefits**

- High Capacity Factor
- Complementary to solar generation profile
- Proximity to load centers
- Utilization of existing coastal transmission infrastructure


### **Obstacles**

- Cost
- Technology risk
- Environmental Unknowns
- Stakeholder Concerns
- Permitting/Coordination
  - Overlapping jurisdictions and responsibilities
