- 2010 U.S. National Ocean Policy
- 2013-14 West Coast Government (State, Tribal, Federal) Outreach
- 2015 First regional in-person meeting
- 2016 West Coast Regional Planning Body Charter
- 2017-18 Regional Tasks + Sub-regional Planning Teams + Stakeholder Outreach + Etc.
- 2018 New Federal Oceans Exec. Order



### New Federal Oceans Executive Order

- West Coast Regional Planning Body
  - No required Fed participation
  - No formal regional / sub-regional "ocean plans"
- Federal Agencies' New Role & Engagement on West Coast
- State & Tribal Government Leadership
- Consensus on Regional Goals & Objectives
- Continued Funding & Regional Capacity



### West Coast: What's Next?

- State & Tribal Governments: Continue West Coast Regional Dialog
- Federal Agencies: Continued Engagement per new Exec. Order
- Decide New Structure ASAP
- Key Elements:
  - Regional Communication
  - Sub-regional Priority Actions (Working Groups)
  - Link to West Coast Ocean Data Portal
  - Stakeholder Outreach & Engagement



### West Coast Goals & Objectives

#### COMPATIBLE AND SUSTAINABLE OCEAN USES

- Increase understanding of past, current, and future interactions among ocean uses and the ocean and coastal ecosystem
- Proactively engage federal, tribal, state and local authorities to assimilate current and emerging regional ocean issues

#### EFFECTIVE AND TRANSPARENT DECISION-MAKING

- Host an intergovernmental forum that supports open, transparent, and equitable dialogue based on a common vision for the West Coast
- Develop a clear, collective understanding of all co-management responsibilities and jurisdictions
- Avoid duplication in planning by building on existing efforts and including all relevant management entities

#### COMPREHENSIVE OCEAN AND COASTAL DATA

- Facilitate ongoing discovery of, connectivity to, and sharing of data and science from all relevant entities through the
  West Coast Ocean Data Portal
- Include traditional knowledge in databases as appropriate
- Identify core data sets and produce synthesized data products to incorporate in decision-making Identify data gaps and
  collaborate to fill them

# • INCREASED UNDERSTANDING OF AND RESPECT FOR TRIBAL RIGHTS, TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE, RESOURCES AND PRACTICES

- Improve understanding of tribal rights and trust responsibilities
- Ensure inclusion and consideration of traditional knowledge in ocean management and decision-making as appropriate
- Improve awareness and recognition of traditional ocean uses

- Develop Regional Work Plan w/ Action Items
- Continue Sub-regional Forums (WA Coast, OR-Northern CA Coast)
  - Offshore Project Notification Framework
  - Priority Policy & Management Topics

- Stakeholder Communication & Engagement
  - Renewable Offshore Energy
